There are a variety of reasons a student may seek to transition away from school, such as job status, relocation, or life event. Whatever the reason, returning to school after a long period of time can result in challenges thus requiring our educational institutions to understand their needs and provide resources appropriate for their return to their academic life.

Session 7—Inclusive Language: What to say and what not to say (Grand Glaize—Prerecorded Session)

Description: As the concept of intersectional identities is becoming more mainstream, front-facing offices in higher education have struggled with what language to use and what not to say. This session will provide the participants with information on utilizing gender neutral language, understand what inclusive language is, and what language is acceptable across the areas of race, gender and sexual orientation. With the audience being admissions and registrar personnel, this session will also provide participants with language to use with students, when to use the legal name, and documentation. This session will provide a “how-to” on developing and understanding inclusive language and how to engage in dialogue utilizing inclusive language.

Since the presentation in 2019, MU has continued to develop the CLR, piloted several processes and developed a prototype. 
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
